

This Project will be due on Friday, April 24th

Your job is to solve “The Case of Pete’s Pet”

Each day you will be given a sheet that will give you clues. After each activity you will record your clues on the first page from the first day.

Directions:

On the **Day 1** you will have 2 pages. The first page you use to keep track of the clues you uncover each day. Today you will solve the maze. First you must get the answers to all the math problems. The maze does not go in order... I did the first three for you. When you circle a picture or word along the side, those are NOT the answer. I showed you how to do the first one. You may not have a circle on all four sides. (if you look at the bottom there are only three places so....). Once you uncover the clues, you go back to the first page and keep track of them. I showed you, using Lester.

Day 2:

You will complete the math questions. Each question is listed on the bottom of the page. Above each number is a line, find the letter that corresponds with the answer for that question and put it on the line. You will spell out more clues. Go back to page one and record your clues.

Day 3:

A maze... but a weird maze... it goes in a spiral. I tried to add some arrows to help. Most importantly pay attention to the numbers in the little boxes. That is where the answer to that question STARTS. If the number is negative, put a negative sign in the first box then the number starts in the next box. Then, go in order from left to right, and take the number from the shaded boxes, find the letter that goes along and put it on the line. You will get 2 more clues to record on the first page.

Day 4:

This one seems pretty self-explanatory. Just make sure you read the directions. Record the two clues on the first sheet.

Day 5:

This has two sheets you will have to look at. In the original packet the answers were on many pages and I didn’t want you to have to print them all. You will complete the 10 math problems. Put the words or phrases that go along with your answers in the key word column. There will be words and phrases. They will form a clue.... Or maybe the answer???? Find out!
